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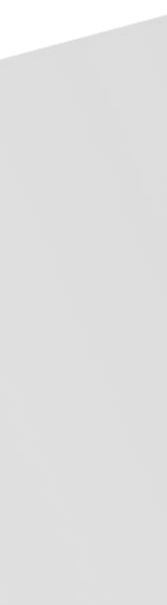


- Department as the MA introduced a number of administrative flexibilities to assist with the ability of the LAGs to maintain programme continuity
 - Flexibility around holding meetings via teleconferencing and written procedures,
 - Facilitated working from home by accepting electronic signatures on documents, email signatures, alternatives to scanning documents
 - Desk based OTSC, no on site visits

 1,425 core projects, with a value of over €60 million, were approved for LEADER funding by the LAGs in the twelve-month period to 31 January 2021

 - Smart Villages

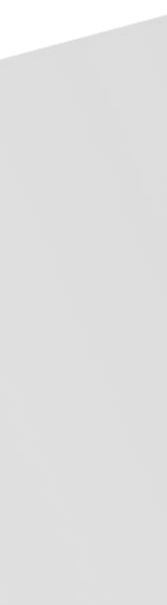
Request for further flexibility on 2014-2020 Programme: Minister Humphreys extended the 2014-2020 programme to 31st March 2021

Transitional Programme features

- €20 Million initial allocation for the programme
- Allocated in line with the 2014-2020 programme across the 29 LAGs
- \in 15 million in projects and \in 5 million for administration
- Further allocation provided for administration for 2014-2020 programme
- Continue the two national LEADER Programmes: Lead Food Initiative & Cooperation measure.



Launched in December 2020 by Minister Humphreys and begins on 1st April 2021 to 31st December 2022



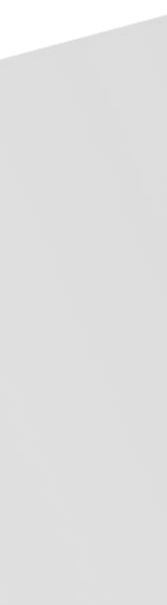


Transitional Programme features continued

- Delivered through the current LAG and Implementing Partner structures
- challenges in their sub-regional area
- Current 2014-2020 programme project funding allocated by 31st March 2021.
- Recommit un-used funding until December 2022.
- Increasing the maximum rate of aid applicable for private enterprises from 50% to 75%
 - Applies to community projects with commercial basis and social enterprises
 - Effective from 1st April 2021 for new applications received on or after that date



New LDS not required but LAGs will be permitted to amend their existing LDS to address emerging

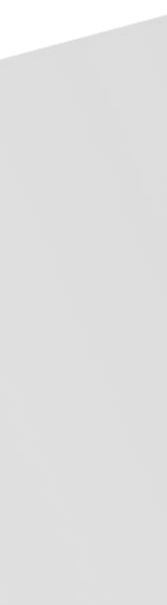

Explore and develop projects for funding in thematic areas which are likely to feature strongly in the next EU-





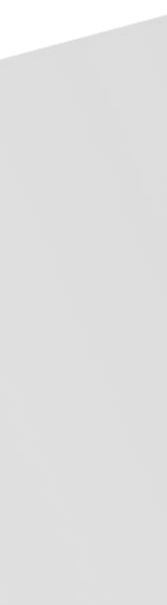
Priorities of Transitional Programme
